

**County Office and Department Reports** 

Landfill Liaison Report January 3, 2019 December 2018 Report

#### **CFS Landfill:**

- 1. CFS received their permit to operate (PTO) the new cell on Friday, December 21, 2018.
- 2. They opened the new cell on December 24, 2018. They began with the 12 foot layer of fluff trash before using the compactor.
- SInce entering the new cell they have consistently kept three days of cover dirt at the working face. This meets DEQ requirements and allows for three days of cover during a bad weather event.
- 4. They are using a temporary leachate pond until the holding tanks arrive and are put into service.
- The scale company has worked on the scales on two different occasions this
  month per the Department of Weights and Measures. The problems were faulty
  load cells and heavy mud deposits under the scale.

### Citizens Complaints:

Mr. Burgess called with an odor complaint. The contractor was widening the
access road to the new cell and per the construction documents dug into the
edge of the old landfill (Permit #227). The exposed trash was hauled up to the
working face and mixed in with the regular trash causing the odor issue. When
the cover was applied for the day the smell dissipated.

#### Comments:

 The new cell has created an environment that is a more efficient and professional operation.

### Convenience Sites:

- This month brought some interesting problems to the hauling side. We had a snowstorm and bitter temperatures early in the month that hindered hauling from the sites. We continue having rain events that slow down the hauling operations.
- The holiday always creates more can pulls than normal. We seemed to have survived the holidays with a few overfilled cans and trash on the ground.



The Joint Working Committee had a meeting on Thursday, December 13<sup>th</sup> at the Victoria Town Hall at 3:30 p.m. to review the entire Draft Joint Lunenburg/Kenbridge/Victoria Comprehensive Plan Update. The Joint Working Committee provided revisions and comments that the CRC addressed, and a new revised Plan will be sent to the Committee for review at their January 10<sup>th</sup> Committee meeting.

Public Hearing dates for adoptionhave been delayed to a February/March timeframe.



### CRC December 2018Items of Interest

#### **New Ventures**

- CRC staff assisted the Ward Burton Wildlife Foundation (WBWF) to apply for funding from the Virginia Environmental Endowment and a preliminary request to S.C. Johnson for funding to expand the Foundations educational programs.
- The CRC & STEPS, Inc. were notified by VHDA that the STEPS, Inc. Community Impact Grant to develop an Affordable Housing Strategic Plan for Prince Edward County was funded.
- CRC staff assisted the Town of Drakes Branch in submitting a Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant to VDEM in November for funding to be utilized towards the cost of a new Municipal Building (including fire department).
- The CRC was notified that the Presidential Disaster Declaration was approved for Tropical Storm Michael. The entire state of Virginia is eligible for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funding, and the localities covered under the declaration are eligible for Public Assistance funding to cover emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the storm from October 9 to October 16. Localities in the CRC Region eligible for Public Assistance Funding are Amelia, Charlotte, Lunenburg and Prince Edward Counties. The CRC is available to assist localities in applying for funding.
- CRC staff are assisting Kenbridge, Victoria & Lunenburg in developing a VHDA Community Impact Grant for funding of a Housing Needs Study focusing on Affordable Rental Units.
- Todd Gordon with the Berkley Group, provided the CRC an update on the CRC Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) at the December CRC Meeting.
- Next CRC Meeting date--Wednesday, January 16, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. The CRC will be meeting at the Farmville Library, Conference Room (1303 West Third St). The meetings are joint meetings with the County Administrators.

#### Activity

- CRC Transportation Committee met in December and received a presentation from Mr. Chris Wichman, Intermodal Planning and Investment, Office of the Secretary of Transportation on an Update of VTrans – Virginia's Statewide Multimodal Transportation Plan.
- CRC staff provided amedia presentation at the DEQ (hosted) combined Soil and Water Conservation
   District/Planning District Chesapeake Bay Implementation Plan WIP III Meeting in Remington, Virginia.
- CRC staff hosted a combined local Soil and Water Conservation Districts/CRC Chesapeake Bay Implementation Plan WIP III Meeting in Farmville, VA, to review final submissions to DEQ.
- CRC staff continue to provide funding source information and assistance to County School systems.
- Regional Emergency Planning Activities CRC staff have drafted Debris Management Plans for Amelia,
   Buckingham and Charlotte and are currently collecting data to complete Lunenburg and Prince Edward drafts.
- The CRChas submitted final revisions of the CRC region's data for the development of the DEQ Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan, Phase III to DEQ.
- Town of Charlotte Court House Evergreen Road Sidewalk Project -A Surveyor has completed the surveys of the property in the project areain order to seek VDOT approved donation of easements.
- AMT is making the final revisions to the Draft Drakes Branch Flood Protection Studyto be presented to the Town of Drakes Branch.
- CRC staff are completing a report on the Community Meeting held in November for the Keysville Comprehensive Plan Update.
- Dillwyn CDBG Housing Rehabilitation Project The Dillwyn Housing Rehabilitation Board approved bids received on 2 houses in the project area with construction to start in January 2019.

County School System

As part of the CRC's ongoing efforts to provide grant writing services for Lunenburg County Public Schools, the following activities have taken place since November 21, 2018:

- I am continuing to work with the Ward Burton Wildlife Foundation (WBWF) to help them secure funding for an expansion of their educational outreach program, which works with schools in Virginia's Region 8 - which includes Lunenburg County. In addition to the application to the Coca-Cola Foundation, which was submitted in late October, we assisted the WBWF on an application to the Virginia Environmental Endowment (submitted December 1) and a preliminary application to S.C. Johnson (submitted December 5).
- We expect to hear in early January whether the County's application to the Baseball Tomorrow Fund (BTF), for funds to build new baseball and softball fields for Lunenburg County Public Schools, was approved for funding.
