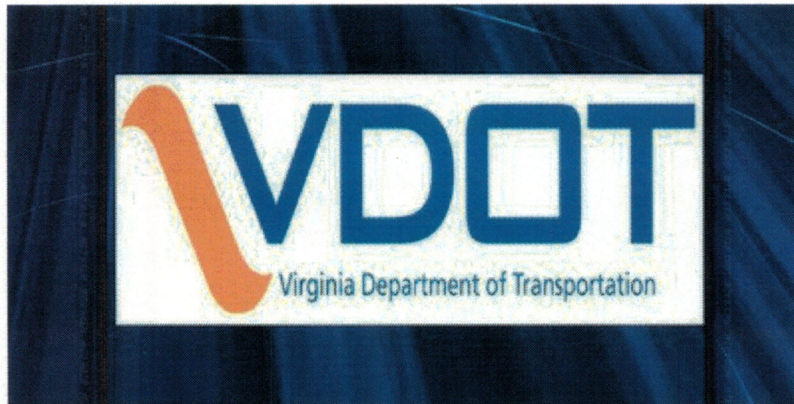

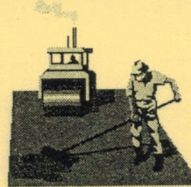

Landfill Liaison Report

June 5, 2019

May 2019 Report

CFS Landfill:

1. They are in the process of constructing a new access road and ramp on the backside of the cell. This will begin the process of raising the height of the current cell.
2. CFS has informed me of their preliminary plan to begin construction of the next new cell this coming September.
3. They are still awaiting the arrival of the leachate storage tanks. As for now they continue to haul the leachate to the Town of Victoria.
4. The working face meets daily regulatory parameters on a consistent basis.

Citizen Complaints:

1. CFS continues to receive complaints about trucks speeding on Old Mansion Road. They also have had complaints about drivers continuing to park alongside Old Mansion Road during the early morning hours.

Comments:

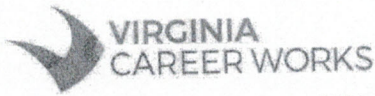
